

<p><b>Nominations process</b></p>	<p>Students interested in studying at Humber on exchange must be nominated by their home institution. The home institution should send the student’s name, email address and home institution program to <a href="mailto:studyabroad@humber.ca">studyabroad@humber.ca</a> by October 8, 2021. The Home Institution must instruct the student to submit the <b>NEW</b> online application form.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <a href="#">Online Study Abroad Application Form</a></li> </ul> <p>The student will be asked to submit the Transcript of Records, signed Learning Agreement and a photocopy of their passport directly on the Online Application Form. Please instruct the students to submit their online application form by the nomination deadline, <b>October 8, 2021.</b></p>
<p><b>Nominations approval</b></p>	<p>Once the nomination has been reviewed, the International Mobility Coordinator will issue the student an official Acceptance Letter together with pre-arrival and accommodation information.</p>

## Insurance

Exchange students are responsible for paying for the International Student Insurance provided through Humber, currently Morecare. Students may elect to purchase additional insurance as needed.

## Transcript of records

The official academic transcript for each exchange student will be mailed to the International Office of their home institution in addition to an emailed digital copy at the end of the term.



## Study material

Students should budget \$500-800 CAD for course textbooks.

## Approximate monthly costs

\$600 - 800 CAD per month (this does not include accommodation).

### Lakeshore Campus:

**+Suite Style:** \$4,616 CAD      **+ Mandatory Meal plan rate:** \$1,175 CAD

### North Campus:

**+Single Dorm Style:** \$3,772 CAD


The mandatory meal plan can be used in designated on-campus cafeterias and coffee/tea shops. Students who have a remaining credit of >\$25 CAD on their meal plan at the end of the semester will have the balance returned to them.
