5. Students should complete at least one cross-department course within the specified number of years to meet one of the graduation requirements.
6. Core courses of the college: "Introduction to Management", "Introduction to Creativity".
7. Course selection and retakes by students in this department must be handled in accordance with the relevant regulations of the "Course Selection and Guidance Measures for Students of the Department of English for Global Communication of Hungkuang University".
8. If you obtain the second specialty certificate, all the courses you take can be recognized as graduation credits.
9. In addition to completing the required credits for graduation, other graduation conditions must comply with the provisions of the school's academic regulations to be eligible for graduation.
