(3) Electives – 38 Credits

1.A minimum of 18 credits must be completed from **common electives and professional electives**.

2.The department allows up to **20 credits of cross-department electives**, including a maximum of **6 credits** from courses offered by the General Education Center (up to **4 credits** from physical education courses) to be counted toward graduation requirements.

3.Military training for National Defense Education is not counted toward graduation credits.

Notes:

1. Students should **keep this table safely until graduation**. Each student should use the subject list as a reference for course registration and retakes.
2. Courses requiring computer equipment: **Application Programming**.
3. Day-program students must, within the prescribed period, complete all **required credits of the department**. In addition:

English proficiency must meet the standards set in the “**Implementation Guidelines for English Graduation Qualification of the Department of English for Global Communication, Hungkuang University.**”

Information literacy must meet the standards specified in the “**Information Literacy Assessment Standards of the Department of English for Global Communication, Hungkuang University.**”
Only then will students be eligible for graduation.

4. Students must complete **at least one cross-department program** within the prescribed period to satisfy one of the graduation requirements.
5. **College core courses:** *Management and Basic Creative Design*.
6. Course registration, retakes, and makeup courses must follow the “**Course Registration and Counseling Regulations for Students of the Department of English for Global Communication, Hungkuang University.**”
7. In addition to completing the required graduation credits, students must meet **other graduation requirements as stipulated in the university regulations** to be eligible for graduation.
